## ACADEMIC ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

### Domestic

Successful completion of NCEA Level 2, including: 12 credits in Mathematics (excluding statistics), a minimum of 12 literacy credits at NCEA Level 1, or above.

### International

Successful completion of one year of tertiary study in the fields of either architecture, business, construction or quantity surveying and/or one year work experience within the industry is preferred or high school diploma + online interview.

## ENGLISH REQUIREMENTS

<b>IELTS</b>	Overall band of 6.0 with no individual band less than 5.5.
<b>PTE</b>	50 overall score – with no band score lower than 42.
<b>TOEFL IBT</b>	Overall score of 60 (with at least 18 in Writing).

## CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Quantity Surveyors can budget, price, and financially administer construction projects. Typical roles include estimators, procurement managers, cost managers, assist quantity survey, contract administrators and contract managers. With further experience, quantity surveyors can lead into the fields of project management, commercial management, and disputes resolution.

During the programme, students can apply for free student membership of the New Zealand Institute of Quantity Surveyors (NZIQS). Upon graduation and acquiring industry work experience, students can advance to full membership. NZIQS is a member of the Pacific Association of Quantity Surveyors (PAQS), which includes member countries such as China, Japan, Philippines, Canada, Australia and South Africa.
